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## MANDATED REPORTERS:

In Illinois, certain professionals are **MANDATED REPORTERS** for elder abuse, neglect, and exploitation of adults age 60 or older, or individuals with disabilities age 18-59 who are unable to report for themselves due to a disability. These professionals must report suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation to Adult Protective Services (APS) or a designated agency.

“**Mandated reporter**” means any of the following persons while engaged in carrying out their professional duties:

- (1) a professional or professional’s delegate while engaged in: (i) social services, (ii) law enforcement, (iii) education, (iv) the care of an eligible adult or eligible adults, or (v) any of the occupations required to be licensed under the Behavior Analyst Licensing Act, the Clinical Psychologist Licensing Act, the Clinical Social Work and Social Work Practice Act, the Illinois Dental Practice Act, the Dietitian Nutritionist Practice Act, the Marriage and Family Therapy Licensing Act, the Medical Practice Act of 1987, the Naprapathic Practice Act, the Nurse Practice Act, the Nursing Home Administrators Licensing and Disciplinary Act, the Illinois Occupational Therapy Practice Act, the Illinois Optometric Practice Act of 1987, the Pharmacy Practice Act, the Illinois Physical Therapy Act, the Physician Assistant Practice Act of 1987, the Podiatric Medical Practice Act of 1987, the Respiratory Care Practice Act, the Professional Counselor and Clinical Professional Counselor Licensing and Practice Act, the Illinois Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology Practice Act, the Veterinary Medicine and Surgery Practice Act of 2004, and the Illinois Public Accounting Act;
- (1.5) an employee of an entity providing developmental disabilities services or service coordination funded by the Department of Human Services;
- (2) an employee of a vocational rehabilitation facility prescribed or supervised by the Department of Human Services;
- (3) an administrator, employee, or person providing services in or through an unlicensed community based facility;

## Mandated Reporters continued:

- (4) any religious practitioner who provides treatment by prayer or spiritual means alone in accordance with the tenets and practices of a recognized church or religious denomination, except as to information received in any confession or sacred communication enjoined by the discipline of the religious denomination to be held confidential;
- (5) field personnel of the Department of Healthcare and Family Services, Department of Public Health, and Department of Human Services, and any county or municipal health department;
- (6) personnel of the Department of Human Services, the Guardianship and Advocacy Commission, the State Fire Marshal, local fire departments, the Department on Aging and its subsidiary Area Agencies on Aging and provider agencies, except the State Long Term Care Ombudsman and any of his or her representatives or volunteers where prohibited from making such a report pursuant to 45 CFR 1324.11(e)(3)(iv);
- (7) any employee of the State of Illinois not otherwise specified herein who is involved in providing services to eligible adults, including professionals providing medical or rehabilitation services and all other persons having direct contact with eligible adults;
- (8) a person who performs the duties of a coroner or medical examiner;
- (9) a person who performs the duties of a paramedic or an emergency medical technician; or
- (10) a person who performs the duties of an investment advisor.

## ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES ACT:

The Adult Protective Services Act (320 ILCS 20) outlines that any physician who willfully fails to report as required by this Act shall be referred to the Illinois State Medical Disciplinary Board. Any dentist, dental hygienist or optometrist who willfully fails to report as required by this Act shall be referred to the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation. Any other mandated reporter required by this Act to report suspected abuse, neglect, or financial exploitation and, who willfully fails to report the same, is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

*Services provided for older adults and disabled adults (age 18-59) include:*

**Adult Protective Service Program:** Investigates all forms of abuse for persons aged 60 and over and adults with disabilities age 18 and over including abandonment, confinement, emotional abuse, financial exploitation, passive neglect, physical abuse, self-neglect, sexual abuse, and willful deprivation.

**Care Coordination Program:** Provides comprehensive, long term care coordination for those 60+ who need assistance in maintaining independent living.

**Caregiver Advisory Program:** Offers supportive service to caregivers and grandparents raising grandchildren. As funds allow, respite care can also be provided. Dementia Care training and support.

**Money Management:** Utilizes trained volunteers to work with seniors on budgeting, sorting through mail, balancing checkbooks and bill paying for persons 60+.

**Adult Activity Center:** Hosts a variety of activities and services including guest speakers.

**Nutrition Program:** Provides breakfast, lunch, and home delivered meals for persons 60+.

**Violent Crime Victim Assistance:** Assists older adults who are victims of violent crimes and fraud/scams committed by strangers that may impact the safety, mental, and physical well-being of persons 55+.

*Services include:*

**Care Coordination:** Care coordinators collaborate with community providers to develop integrated assessments and treatment plans to ensure the needs of people served are met.

**Crosspoint Human Services continued**

**Children's Counseling:** Individual and parent/child support, advocacy, and group counseling.

**Community Day Services:** A day program for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

**Domestic Violence Program:** 24/7 crisis line, temporary shelter and comprehensive services for survivors, their children and family members who are experiencing domestic violence, and community-based services (legal, advocacy/care coordination, referrals, groups) for those not needing shelter.

**Early Intervention:** Crosspoint provides developmental evaluations and developmental therapy services to children from birth to three years old with developmental delays or disabilities.

**Early Learning Center:** Licensed day care and developmentally appropriate curriculum for children aged 15 months to 6 years. State Subsidy Accepted. M-F 6:30am-5:30 pm

**Housing:** Housing services are provided in a variety of settings which are supervised 24/7.

**Individual, Family & Couple's Therapy:** Master level clinicians versed in evidence-based practices facilitate mental health therapy and counseling to assist people served in achieving their personal goals.

**Legal Advocacy:** Support through the legal system and assistance with obtaining, modifying, or extending different orders of protection.

**Medical Advocacy:** Advocate on call 24/7 to respond to emergency room or other safe locations to provide services and support.

**Other Services:** Intensive behavioral support services, vocational services, professional training, public education, institutional advocacy, and prevention work.

**Partner Abuse Intervention Program:** Group instruction and peer support for those that cause harm to others. Men and Women's 26-week prevention education program.

**Permanent Housing Program:** Using the Housing First Approach. Supportive housing and comprehensive services for women and their children experiencing homelessness. Assisting with the skills necessary for hours in stability, safety, and security.

**Psychiatry:** Psychiatric evaluation, medication management, medication training, and medication monitoring.

**Counseling:** Individuals, family, and group counseling is available for survivors and their significant others.

**Prevention Education:** Prevention education presentations are available for school, community groups, churches, and employers.

**Medical Advocacy:** Advocates respond to the emergency room 24 hours a day to provide emotional support and information to survivors.

**Legal Advocacy:** Legal advocate to accompany survivors through the criminal justice system, assists survivors through the criminal justice system, as well as assist in completing Civil No Contact Orders, Orders of Protection, and Stalking No Contact Orders.

**Case Management:** Case Managers help with any needs a survivor may have outside of regular counseling. The case manager assesses the needs of the victim and assists with food needs, changing locks, completion of forms and paperwork, as well as education preparation.

**Hotline:** Our 24-hour local hotline offers help to survivors and families.

# LEGAL DEFINITIONS AND STATUTES

## PHYSICAL ABUSE:

### Assault

**720 ILCS 5/12-1**

**Class C Misdemeanor** “A person commits an assault when, without lawful authority, he or she knowingly engages in conduct which places another in reasonable apprehension of receiving a battery”

### Aggravated Assault

**720 ILCS 5/12-2**

**Class A Misdemeanor** “A person commits aggravated assault when, in committing an assault, he or she knows the individual assaulted to be a person with a physical disability or a person 60 years of age or older and the assault is without legal justification”

### Battery

**720 ILCS 5/12-3**

**Class A Misdemeanor** “A person commits battery if he or she knowingly without legal justification by any means (1) causes bodily harm to an individual or (2) makes physical contact of an insulting or provoking nature with an individual”

### Aggravated Battery

**720 ILCS 5/12-3.05**

**Class 3 Felony; Class 2 Felony** (if great bodily harm); **Class X felony** (if great bodily harm to severely and profoundly intellectually disabled person) “Knowingly causing bodily harm to or making physical contact of an insulting or provoking nature with an elderly person or a disabled person”

### Domestic Battery

**720 ILCS 5/12-3.2**

**First offense:** Class A Misdemeanor, **Second Offense:** Class 4 Felony “Causing bodily harm to or making physical contact of an insulting or provoking nature with any family or household member”

### Aggravated Domestic Battery

**720 ILCS 5/12-3.3**

**Class 2 Felony** “Causing great bodily harm to a family or household member”

### Tampering w/Food, Drugs,

### Cosmetics

**720 ILCS 5/12-4.5**

**Class 2 Felony** “A person who knowingly puts any substance capable of causing death or great bodily harm to a human being into any food, drug or cosmetic offered for sale or consumption commits tampering with food, drugs or cosmetics.”

## SEXUAL ABUSE:

### Sexual Relations within Families

**720 ILCS 5/11-11**

**Class 3 Felony** “Commits an act of sexual penetration with a person he knows is related to him.”

### Solicitation of a Sexual Act

**720 ILCS 5/11-14.1**

**Class A Misdemeanor; Class 4 Felony** “If from a person with a severe or profound intellectual disability. Any person who offers a person not his or her spouse any money, property, token, object, or article or anything of value for that person or any other person not his or her spouse to perform any act of sexual penetration, or any touching or fondling of the sex organs of one person by another person for the purpose of sexual arousal or gratification”

### Criminal Sexual Assault

**720 ILCS 5/11-1.20**

**First offense: Class 1 Felony; Second Offense: Class X Felony** “Commits an act of sexual penetration and uses force or threat of force; or knows that the victim is unable to understand the nature of the act or is unable to give knowing consent.”

### Aggravated Criminal Sexual

### Assault

**720 ILCS 5/11-1.30**

**Class X Felony: Second Offense: Natural Life Imprisonment** “Commits an act of sexual penetration by force or threat of force, or where the victim is unable to consent, and the victim is 60 years of age or older”

### Criminal Sexual Abuse

**720 ILCS 5/11-1.50**

**Class 4 Felony** “Commits an act of sexual conduct by the use of force or threat of force; or commits an act of sexual conduct and knows that the victim is unable to understand the nature of the act or is unable to give knowing consent.”

### Aggravated Criminal Sexual Abuse

**720 ILCS 5/11-1.60**

**Class 2 Felony** “Commits an act of sexual conduct by force or threat of force, or where the victim is unable to consent, with a person aged 60 or older”

## EMOTIONAL ABUSE:

### Intimidation

**720 ILCS 5/12-6**

**Class 3 Felony** “A person commits intimidation when, with intent to cause another to perform or to omit the performance of any act, he or she communicates to another, directly or indirectly by any means, a threat to perform without lawful authority to inflict physical harm on the person threatened or any other person or on property; or subject any person to physical confinement or restraint”

## Emotional Abuse continued

### Stalking

**720 ILCS 5/ 12-7.3**

**First offense: Class 4 Felony,  
Second offense: Class 3 Felony**

“A person commits stalking when he or she knowingly engages in a course of conduct directed at a specific person, and he or she knows or should know that this course of conduct would cause a reasonable person to fear for his or her safety or the safety of a third person; or suffer other emotional distress”

### Aggravated Stalking

**720 ILCS 5/ 12-7.4**

**First offense: Class 3 Felony;  
Second offense: Class 2 Felony**

“A person commits aggravated stalking when he or she commits stalking and :causes bodily harm to the victim; confines or restrains the victim; or violates a temporary restraining order, an order of protection, a stalking no contact order, a civil no contact order, or an injunction prohibiting the behavior described in subsection (b)(1) of Section 214 of the Illinois Domestic Violence Act of 1986”

### Cyber Stalking

**720 ILCS 5/ 12-7.5**

**Class 2 or 3 Felony** “A person commits cyber stalking when he or she engages in a course of conduct using electronic communication directed at a specific person, and he or she knows or should know that would cause a reasonable person to fear for his or her safety or the safety of third person; or suffer other emotional distress”.

NOTE: Some property crimes have an emotional component (threats / duress)

### **NEGLECT/WILLFUL DEPRIVATION:**

#### Criminal Abuse of a Long-Term Care Facility Residence

**720 ILCS 5/12-4.4a(1)**

**Class 3 Felony** “A person or an owner or licensee of a long-term care facility who knowingly causes any physical or mental injury to or commits any sexual offense against a resident.”

#### Criminal Neglect of a Long-Term Care Facility Residence

**720 ILCS 5/12-4.4a(2)**

**Class 4 Felony; 3 Felony if it  
Results in Death** “A person or an owner or licensee of a long-term care facility who •Recklessly performs acts that cause the resident’s life to be endangered, health to be injured, or pre-existing condition to deteriorate •Recklessly fails to perform acts that he knows or should know are necessary to preserve the life or health of the residence •Abandons a resident”

## Neglect/Willful Deprivation continued

### Neglect of a Long-Term Care Facility Resident:

**720 ILCS 5/12-4.4a(3)**

**Petty offense** “A person or an owner or licensee of a long-term care facility who negligently fails to provide adequate care resulting in physical or mental injury by failing to exercise reasonable care in the hiring, training, and supervising of staff”

### Criminal Abuse or Neglect of an Elderly Person or Person with a Disability:

**720 ILCS 5/12-4.4a(b)**

**Class 3 Felony; Class 2 Felony if  
it results in death**

“A caregiver knowingly: •Performs acts that cause the person’s life to be endangered, health to be injured, or pre-existing physical or mental condition to deteriorate, or •Fails to perform acts that he knows are necessary to maintain or preserve the life or health of the person, and that failure causes the person’s life to be endangered, health to be injured, or pre-existing physical or mental condition to deteriorate, or •Abandons the person •Physically abuses, harasses, intimidates, or interferes with the personal liberty of the person, or •Exposes the person to willful deprivation”

## Criminal Neglect of an Elderly Person or Person with a Disability

**720 ILCS 5/12-4.4a(b)**

**Petty offense** “A person or an owner or licensee of a long-term care facility who negligently fails to provide adequate care resulting in physical or mental injury by failing to exercise reasonable care in the hiring, training, and supervising of staff”

### **CONFINEMENT:**

#### Unlawful Restraint

**720 ILCS 5/ 10-3**

**Class 4 Felony** “Knowingly and without authority detaining a person.”

#### Aggravated Unlawful Restraint

**720 ILCS 5/ 10-3.1**

**Class 3 Felony** “Knowingly and without authority detaining a person while using a deadly weapon.”

### Aggravated Stalking

**720 ILCS 5/ 12-7.4**

**Class 3 or 2 Felony** “A person commits aggravated stalking when he or she commits stalking and causes bodily harm to the victim; confines or restrains the victim; or violates a temporary restraining order, an order of protection, a stalking no contact order, a civil no contact order, or an injunction prohibiting the behavior described in subsection (b)(1) of Section 214 of the Illinois Domestic Violence Act of 1986”

## FINANCIAL EXPLOITATION:

### Theft

**720 ILCS 5/ 16-1**

**Anywhere from Class A misdemeanor to Class X Felony** depending on amount, manner, victim, and priors “Obtains or exerts unauthorized control (or obtains by threat) over property of an owner, and either: •Intends to deprive owner permanently of use or benefit of property •Uses, conceals or abandons the property knowing that it will or probably will deprive the owner permanently of the use or benefit of the property”

### Theft by Deception

**720 ILCS 5/16-1**

**Anywhere from Class A misdemeanor to Class X Felony** depending on amount, manner, victim, and priors “Obtains by deception control over property of the owner, and either: •Intends to deprive owner permanently of use or benefit of property •Uses, conceals or abandons the property knowing that it will or probably will deprive the owner permanently of the use or benefit of the property”

### Home Repair Fraud

**815 ILCS 515/3**

**Class A Misdemeanor to Class 3 Felony** “Depending on contract amounts and number of contracts. “Offender enters into an agreement, written or oral, with a person for home repair, and either: •Misrepresents a material fact •Uses deception, false pretense, or false promises to induce agreement •Enters into an unconscionable agreement of at least \$4000”

### Aggravated Home Repair Fraud

**815 ILCS 515/5**

**Class 3 to Class 2 Felony** “Depending on contract amounts and number of contracts “A person commits the offense of aggravated home repair fraud when he commits home repair fraud against an elderly person or a person with a disability as defined in Section 17-56 of the Criminal Code of 2012; or in connection with a home repair project intended to assist a person with a disability.”

### Forgery

**720 ILCS 5/ 17-3**

**Class 3 Felony** “A person commits forgery when, with intent to defraud, he or she knowingly possesses delivers or makes a false document or alters any document to make it false and that document is apparently capable of defrauding another”

## Financial Exploitation continued

### Financial Exploitation of an Elderly or Disabled Person

**720 ILCS 5/17-56**

**Class 4 to Class 1 Felony**

“Stands in a position of trust or confidence with the elderly person or person with a disability, and either: •Knowingly and by deception or intimidation obtains control over the property of that person, OR •Illegally uses the assets or resources of that person”

### Identify Theft

**720 ILCS 5/16-30**

**Class 3 to X Felony** (depending on amount) “Uses any personal identifying information of another (i.e. PIN number or signature) to fraudulently obtain credit, money, goods, services, or other property”

### Aggravated Identity Theft

**720 ILCS 5/16-30**

**First offense; Class 3 to X Felony** (depending on amount) **Second offense: Class X regardless of amount** “Uses any personal identifying information of another (i.e. PIN number or signature) to fraudulently obtain credit, money, goods, services, or other property AND victim is 60 years of age or older or has a disability”
